

### **The Standard**

The Core Humanitarian Standard on Quality and Accountability (CHS) sets out Nine Commitments that organisations and individuals involved in humanitarian response can use to improve the quality and effectiveness of the assistance they provide. It also facilitates greater accountability to communities and people affected by crisis: knowing what humanitarian organisations have committed to will enable them to hold those organisations to account.



#### Verification

The <u>Core Humanitarian Standard</u> (CHS) is a voluntary and measurable standard, which means its application can be objectively assessed. The <u>CHS Alliance Verification Scheme</u> allows organisations to measure the extent to which they have successfully applied the CHS requirements, and to demonstrate that they have done so through the measurement of more than 80 indicators dividing the nine commitments of the CHS into key actions and organisational responsibilities.



### Average scores by commitments







The <u>Key Actions</u> describe what staff engaged in humanitarian action should do to deliver high-quality programmes consistently and to be accountable to those they seek to assist.

The <u>Organisational Responsibilities</u> describe the policies, processes and systems organisations engaged in humanitarian action need to have in place to ensure their staff provide high-quality, accountable humanitarian assistance.

The <u>Performance Indicators</u> show the feedback from communities. It only appears for the Self-Assessments.



### Score distribution







#### Index scores

(calculated based on multiple indicators relevant for each theme, within the nine commitments - please see below)

This score measures to what extent your organisation is applying CHS requirements which are relevant in terms of the diversity of the communities and people that you assist. The gender & diversity score includes issues such as gender, age and (dis)ability. The score is based on your organisation's scores for the Score Gender Diversity 2.50 following CHS requirements: 1.2, 1.5, 3.3, 3.6, 3.7, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 8.5, 8.7. 





### Gender & diversity index - detailed scores






